NJAA to honor Gov. Chris Christie

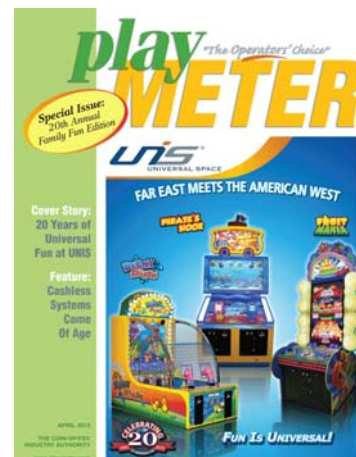
